Union Training Centres - Training Programs Suitable for Feepayer Consideration

Individuals in receipt of regular Employment Insurance (EI) benefits, who are not working may request consideration to attend training activities at their own cost. The training selected must enhance the individual's employment skills and/or job prospects.

To be eligible to continue to collect regular benefits while attending full-time training, an EI recipient must be recommended/referred by Human Services. Prospective trainees should approach Human Services prior to commencement of training and request consideration as a Feepayer. Failure to do so may cause an interruption or disentitlement to their EI benefits.

The following list of programs has been accepted as suitable for referral under the Feepayer option:

Note: Programs recognized for Feepayer consideration are not designated for financial assistance and therefore not eligible for Alberta Works income support, health and training benefits.
