Ministerial Order No. 2016-25

WHEREAS the Government of Canada has introduced the Canada Child Benefit to replace the Canada Child Tax Benefit, the National Child Benefit Supplement and the Universal Child Care Benefit as of July 1, 2016;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Canada may continue to calculate federal child benefit amounts that would have been provided, until June 30, 2017;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 21(1)(b) and 21(2)(b) of the Income Support, Training and Health Benefits Regulation (the Regulation) under the *Income and Employment Supports Act* (the Act), the Minister may determine the federal child benefit amount that would be provided to the household unit if each dependent child were assumed to be eligible for the federal child benefit;


AND WHEREAS, pursuant to Schedule 4, Sections 1 and 5 of the Regulation under Act, the Minister may determine the amount of a child supplement allowance;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to Schedule 4, Section 5(1) of the Regulation under the Act, the Minister may determine eligibility for a child supplement allowance;

I, IRFAN SABIR, Minister of Human Services, hereby:

- 1 Pursuant to Sections 21(1)(b) and 21(2)(b) of the Regulation under the Act, determine the federal child benefit amounts as set out in section 1 of the attached Appendix;
- 2 Pursuant to Schedule 4, Sections 1 and 5 of the Regulation under the Act, determine the amount of a child supplement allowance as set out in section 2 of the attached Appendix; and
- 3 Pursuant to Schedule 4, Section 5(1) of the Regulation under the Act, determine eligibility for a child supplement allowance as set out in section 3 of the attached Appendix.

APPENDIX

1. The federal child benefit amounts are the following amounts which represent the maximum amounts of the National Child Benefit Supplement as calculated by the Government of Canada:
 - (a) \$192 per month for the first dependent child;
 - (b) \$170 per month for the second dependent child; and
 - (c) \$162 per month for each remaining dependent child.
2. The child supplement allowance is the difference between the maximum amount of the National Child Benefit Supplement as calculated by the Government of Canada and as identified in Section 1 of this Appendix and the amount of the National Child Benefit Supplement that the household would have been eligible to receive for the dependent children, but for the termination of the benefit, as calculated by the Government of Canada.
3. A child supplement allowance may be provided when the amount of the National Child Benefit Supplement that the household would have been eligible to receive for the dependent children, but for the termination of the benefit, as calculated by the Government of Canada, is less than the maximum amount of the National Child Benefit Supplement as calculated by the Government of Canada and as identified in Section 1 of this Appendix.
